

PSED

Can usually tolerate delay when needs are not met immediately and understands wishes may not always be met.

Takes steps to resolve conflicts with other Children.

Physical Development

Shows increasing control over an object, in pushing patting, throwing, catching or kicking it.

Holds pencil in a tripod grip (see parents display board)

Begin to form recognisable letters.

Communication and Language

Extends vocabulary especially by grouping and naming, exploring the meaning of new words.

Maintain attention, concentrate and sit quietly during appropriate activity.

Begin to understand 'why' and 'how' questions

Expressive Arts and Design

Explore what happens when they mix colours.

Constructs with a purpose in mind using a variety of materials.

Introduce a storyline or narrative into their play.

Literacy

Write own name and other things such as labels, captions.

Hears and says the initial sounds in words.

Can segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together (CVC words e.g. cat, dog, mum, dad)

Talks about and describes characters, events and settings in stories.

Mathematics

Recognise numerals 1-10.

Begin to use the vocab of adding and subtracting.

Use mathematical names and describe 2D and 3D shapes.

Understanding the World

Look closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change.

Remember and talk about significant events in their own experience.

Use ICT hardware to interact with appropriate computer software.
